An abstract is required for every paper. Your abstract should give readers a brief summary of your article. It should concisely describe the contents of your article and include key terms. It should be informative, accessible, and not only indicate the general scope of the article but also state the main results obtained and conclusions drawn. The abstract should be complete in itself; it should

24 not contain undefined abbreviations, and no table numbers, figure numbers, references or  
25 equations should be referred to. It should be suitable for direct inclusion in abstracting services  
26 and should be within 150-200 words.

## INTRODUCTION

34 [All first-order headings (Header) use Times New Roman, font size 12, bold, and centred]

35 The paper must be in UK/US English. Naturally, your paper should start with a concise and  
36 informative sentence describing the title of the article. Do not use abbreviations in it. Next, list all  
37 authors with their first names or initials and surnames (in that order). Indicate the author for  
38 correspondence. After having listed all authors' names, you should list their respective affiliations.  
39 Link authors and affiliations using superscript lower-case letters. In general, the contents should  
40 comprise Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusion,  
41 Acknowledgement, and References. The manuscript should be supplied with 3-5 keywords.

42 Authors are expected to consider the list and order of authors before submitting their  
43 manuscript and provide the definitive list of authors at the time of the original submission. Any  
44 addition, deletion, or rearrangement of author names in the authorship list should be made only  
45 before the manuscript has been accepted and only if approved by the journal Editor. To request  
46 such a change, the Editor must receive the following from the corresponding author: (a) the reason

47 for the change in the author list and (b) written confirmation (e-mail, letter) from all authors that  
48 they agree with the addition, removal, or rearrangement. In cases of author addition or removal,  
49 this includes confirmation from the author. No additions, deletions, or changes to the authorship  
50 of a paper will be permitted after the article is accepted.

## MATERIALS AND METHODS

53 You will usually want to divide your article into first-order headings and second-order headings  
54 (perhaps even third-order headings). Headings should reflect the relative importance of the  
55 sections. Methods should be described in the past tense, as you are describing work that was carried  
56 out to achieve the objective of the study.

58 **Journal of Oil Palm Research** [Second order headings (subheader) should be bold, Times New  
59 Roman, font size 12, capitalised each first word.]

60 Journal of Oil Palm Research (JOPR) is an international refereed journal on various aspects  
61 of oil palm and/or palm oil. The journal is circulated extensively within Malaysia as well as other  
62 countries to individuals, commercial organisations, agencies related to oil palm and palm oil,  
63 abstracting companies, and academic institutions. JOPR covers the study and exploitation of areas  
64 such as Biology & Sustainability, Food technology, Oleochemistry, Breeding, and Engineering.  
65 Authors should clearly define their category of work in the cover letter. The journal publishes  
66 research articles, reviews, and short communication whose content and approach are of interest to  
67 a wide range of scholars.

68 In order to maintain the high standards associated with JOPR, papers submitted are  
69 thoroughly scrutinised on their quality, especially in their originality, context, and universality of

70 the findings. Of course, they have to be readable in Standard English. Every paper published should  
71 preferably be at the cutting edge of science or share something new and exciting.

73 [Third order headings (sub-subheading) should be bold, italic, Times New Roman, font size 12,  
74 capitalised the first word]

75 **Regular article.** Full-length original empirical investigations, consisting of introduction, materials  
76 and methods, results and discussion, and conclusion. Original work must provide references and  
77 an explanation of research findings that contain new and significant findings. The conclusion  
78 should be brief and focus on the research output, should not be in point form. These papers should  
79 not exceed 6,000 words of text (including tables, figures, and references) and generally not more  
80 than a total of 10 figures and tables. After peer-review, the article's word count limit can be  
81 extended to a maximum of 8,000 words to better address the reviewers' and editors' comments.  
82 Any additional figures or tables can be included in the supplementary data. Please note that papers  
83 submitted to JOPR will be sent back to authors because of poor figure resolution or exceeding the  
84 number of figures permitted.

85

86 **Short communication.** Significant new information to readers of the Journal in a short but  
87 complete form. Preferably not exceeding 3,000 words (including tables, figures, and references),  
88 and is intended for rapid publication. They are not intended for publishing preliminary results or  
89 to be a reduced version of Regular papers.

90

91 **Review article.** Critical evaluation of materials about current research that have already been  
92 published by organising, integrating, and evaluating previously published materials. Re-analyses

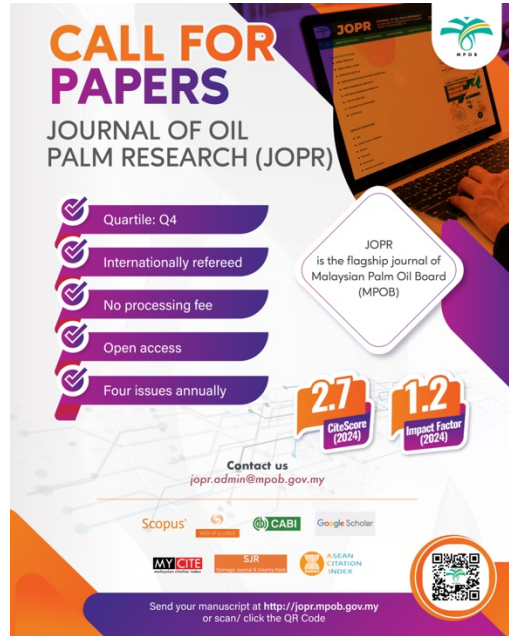
93 as meta-analyses and systematic reviews are encouraged. Review articles provide systemic  
94 overview, evaluation, and interpretation of research in a given field. They should not exceed 12,000  
95 words (including references) and should contain no more than a total of 20 figures and tables. Any  
96 additional figures or tables can be included in the supplementary data. Please note that papers  
97 submitted to JOPR will be sent back to authors because of poor figure resolution or exceeding the  
98 number of figures permitted. The same information should not be repeated in a figure and a table.

## **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION**

101 All illustrations must be labelled and supplied after being introduced in the text. The illustrations  
102 of photographs, schemas, graphs, and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. A figure is to  
103 demonstrate a trend or lead to a conclusive statement, and is a raw spectrum or chromatography  
104 that should be accepted in a scientific article. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a  
105 page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper. These  
106 illustrations should be referred to and numbered serially, as figures (*Figure 1*). All Tables and  
107 Figures cited in the text must be in italics e.g. *Figure 1*. The figure number and caption should be  
108 typed below the illustration in Times New Roman, font size 12, italic, and centred as shown in  
109 *Figure 1* and 2.



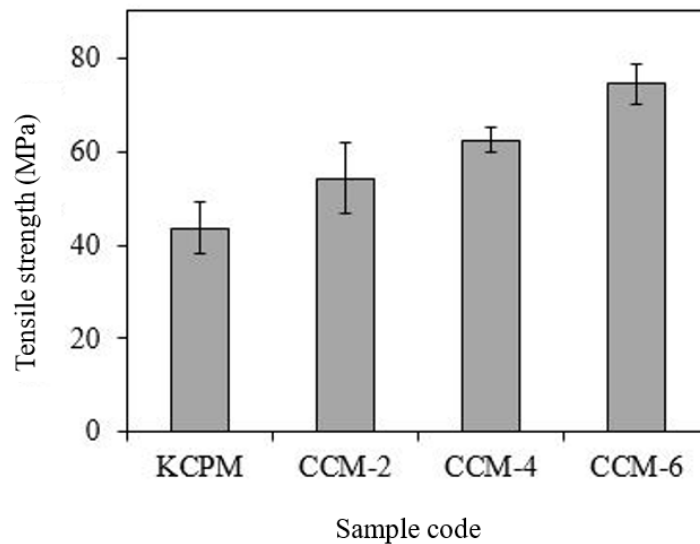

Keep text in the illustrations themselves to a minimum, but explain all symbols and abbreviations used. All the text and numbers in the illustrations must be in Times New Roman and

120 font size 10. Please indicate the Y & X-axis as well as the unit of measurement. Lettering and  
121 symbols should be clearly defined in the caption. Please ensure that all the figures are at least 500  
122 dpi resolution, as this will facilitate good output. All illustrations should be clearly drawn in  
123 permanent ink or photographed in sharp black and white and reproduced in the form of high  
124 contrast glossy prints or digital images and provided in camera-ready form.

125 All tables must be labelled and supplied after being introduced in the text. Tables should  
126 be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference  
127 to them in the paper. These tables should be referred to and numbered serially, as tables (*Table 1*).  
128 Every table should have a caption, and headings should be placed above tables. The table number  
129 and caption should be typed in uppercase, Times New Roman, font size 12, bold, and centred.

136 All the text and numbers in the tables must be in Times New Roman, font size 10, and  
137 centred. In the table heading, no initial capitals except for the first word. Lettering and symbols  
138 should be clearly defined either in the caption of the table. Only horizontal lines should be used  
139 within a table to distinguish the column headings from the body of the table, and immediately

140 above and below the table. *Table 1* is an example that the authors may find useful. Please ensure  
141 that the data presented in figures or tables do not duplicate results described elsewhere in the  
142 article.

## CONCLUSION

145 Manuscripts should be submitted via: <https://www.editorialmanager.com/jopres/default.aspx>. It is  
146 the author's responsibility to ensure that his or her submitted work does not infringe any existing  
147 copyright. Authors should obtain permission to reproduce or adapt copyrighted material and  
148 provide evidence of approval upon submitting the final version of a manuscript. Manuscripts will  
149 be reviewed by the Editorial Board and at least one independent referee. Decisions regarding the  
150 publication of a manuscript will be based on the Board's recommendations. The manuscript will  
151 be evaluated based on its appropriateness for JOPR, contribution to the discipline, cogency of  
152 analysis, conceptual breadth, clarity of presentation, and technical adequacy. Manuscripts  
153 submitted by members of the journal's Editorial Board are subjected to the same review procedure.

## ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

156 The information presented in the acknowledgment section should be kept brief, identify the  
157 contributors responsible for specific parts of the project. It should only mention people directly  
158 involved with the project from a sponsoring institution, other researchers who have helped in the  
159 preparation. This template gives formatting guidelines for authors preparing papers for publication  
160 in the JOPR. The authors must follow the instructions given in the document for the papers to be  
161 published.

## REFERENCES

References in the text should be denoted by giving the name(s) of the author(s). All alphabetically ordered references should be included at the end of the manuscript. All references cited in the text must appear in the reference list and vice versa. In the JOPR manuscript, narrative citations such as Aliza et al. (2020), Adam and Idris (2016), and Malaysian Timber Board (MTB, 2025) are preferred. However, most authors currently use parenthetical citations, e.g., (Faizah et al., 2020; Khairul & Nazmie, 2021; Malaysian Palm Oil Board [MPOB], 2016). Authors are responsible for the accuracy and completeness of all information in the reference. Manuscripts must conform to the references in APA Style 7th edition (<https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines/references/examples>). The reference style adopted should be consistent throughout the manuscript.
